Hackathon Summary

The hackathon will be more than what most expect from a typical 12-hour hackathon – it's structured in a unique fashion, with featured guest speakers, mentors from various local companies, workshops, free food, and varied prizes. The three themes for the hackathon are health, business, and education. Bean bag chairs and a rest area will be provided for hackathon attendees. The number of meals provided will be contingent upon the number of attendees.

Arts Component

The Battle of the Bands connects the local music community of the Tri-Valley and the Bay Area. It'll feature performances by six rock bands with a variety of musical styles and will take place at the amphitheater at Emerald Glen Park.

The Visual Arts Showcase will feature a variety of visual art displays, with the number of pieces contingent upon the number of applications received and space present at the venue (in process of confirmation).
